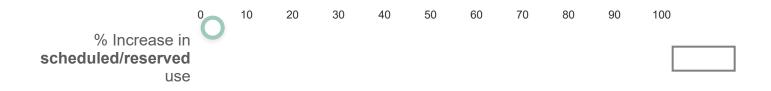

Compared to <u>average use</u> over the last two years, how did **use** change April-July, 2020?



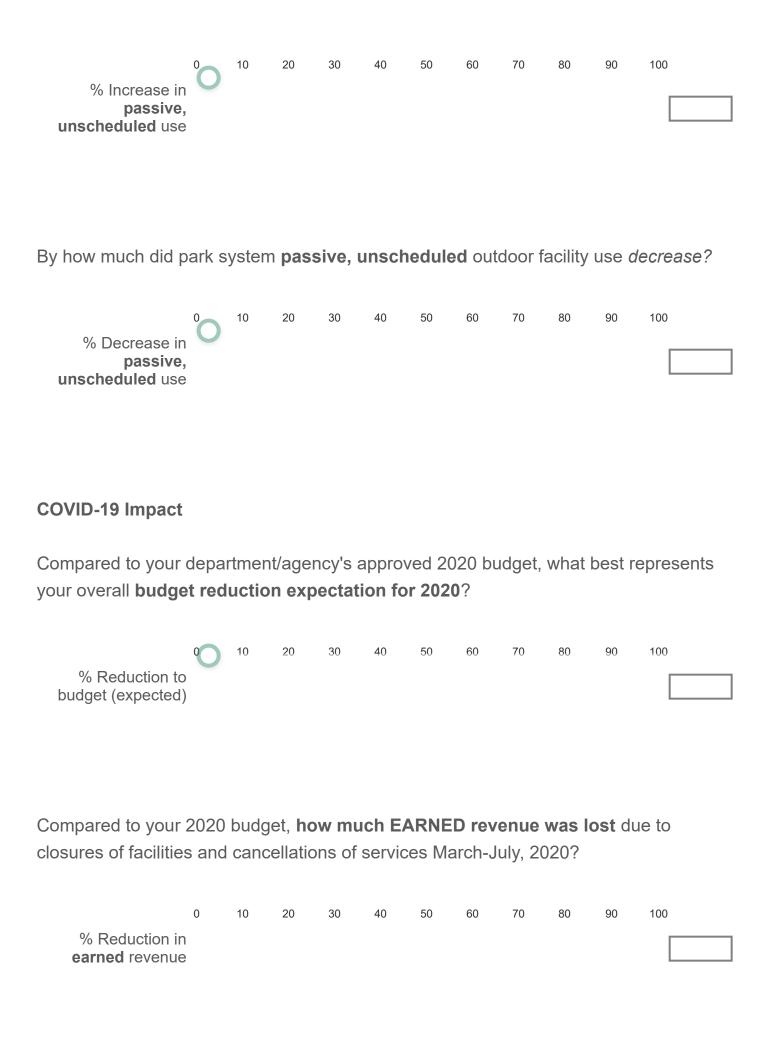
By how much did park system **scheduled/reserved** indoor and outdoor facility and program use *increase?*
