End of Week 1 Report - Sunday, January 15th, 2023

The Washington State Legislature kicked off its business of the 105-day session on Monday, January 9. Legislators got right down to business in week 1, introducing hundreds of bills, scheduling work sessions in committee, and holding public hearings on legislation. As of Friday, January 13, the House has introduced 322 bills, and the Senate 378 bills – totaling 700 bills in the first week.

Monday began with opening ceremonies in both chambers, while legislators officially elected leadership, and new members were sworn in. On Tuesday, Governor Inslee gave his State of the State address. The Governor spoke to his top priorities for the 2023 legislative session, as well as reflected on policies he has advanced in recent years on housing, climate, salmon recovery, and behavioral health. As session progresses, there are key cutoffs that bills need to meet to remain under consideration by the legislature (special exceptions apply). The first legislative deadline is February 17, 2023, when bills must pass out of their respective policy committees to remain alive. See below for important cutoff dates for the 2023 session.
